



Quick Guide - Installation of a Mobile SATA Hard Drive

Installing a mobile hard drive in laptop, notebook, PowerBook, or iBook:

1. Modern mobile computers use recently adopted standard for hard drive called Serial ATA (SATA). SATA uses a simplified connector and a high-speed interface. This means that no jumper setting is required before installing your hard drive making the installation truly plug and play.
2. Refer to your system manual for the correct procedure for mounting your mobile drive.
3. Install the drive in your computer and connect the SATA cable/connector and power. In most cases the power connector will be integrated with the SATA data cable so only one connection is required.
4. When you start up your computer, the BIOS should recognize the drive. Make sure the SATA interface is enabled in your system BIOS. You are now ready to partition the drive.
