Green Procurement

This Europe Green Procurement Policy (GPP) is aligned to Fujitsu's Global Procurement Policy and applies to suppliers supplying Fujitsu entities in the Europe region. It applies to all product and service categories within procurement.

As defined in the Fujitsu Group Environment Policy, we strive to reduce the environmental impact of our ICT products and solutions throughout their entire lifecycle. The lifecycle includes Procurement and applies to suppliers, contractors and business partners.

Our Aim

- Sustainable procurement in accordance with ethical, social, economic and environmental principles applying to our own business operations and to those of our suppliers and supply chain.
- Procure environmentally sustainable goods, services, materials while taking into account global, regional and local impacts.
- Encourage our business areas and suppliers to continually improve their responsible engagement.

Fujitsu Group is committed to sustainable growth and taking a systemic and sustained approach to environmental management. The Fujitsu Way clearly commits Fujitsu at a global level through our corporate value: "in all our actions, we protect the environment and contribute to society".

The Fujitsu Way incorporates the Global Business Standard Code of Conduct which all suppliers must comply in every procurement dealings and business operations.

The Core Values and Goals of our Green Procurement Policy are

- Fujitsu is committed to embracing, supporting and applying the principles of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted by the United Nations. Fujitsu believes in using the influence of Technology to achieve a Human Centric Intelligent Society that supports the SDGs
- Also to adhere to the "FUJITSU Climate and Energy Vision," with the goal of bringing the Fujitsu Group's CO2 emissions to zero by 2050, as well as contributing to the achievement of a decarbonized society and the adaptation to climate change, through provision of technologies and services supporting digital transformation
- Suppliers must take appropriate actions to avoid or reduce negatively contributing to ethical, social, economic and environmental principles.
- Purchase sustainable products and services across our business.
- Subject to criticality, Fujitsu withholds the right to withdraw supplier contracts if a supplier is found to be non-compliant with this environmental policy.

Applicability

This Policy applies to Fujitsu operations in Europe. This means that all Employees, Contractors, Working Partners and businesses carried on by Fujitsu Services Holdings PLC, Fujitsu Technology Solutions (Holding) BV and their subsidiaries, whether they be incorporated within Fujitsu Europe or not, and any other company or organization that is managed by the Head of Europe Region, except to the extent, if any, stated under Exemptions below, must comply with it.
